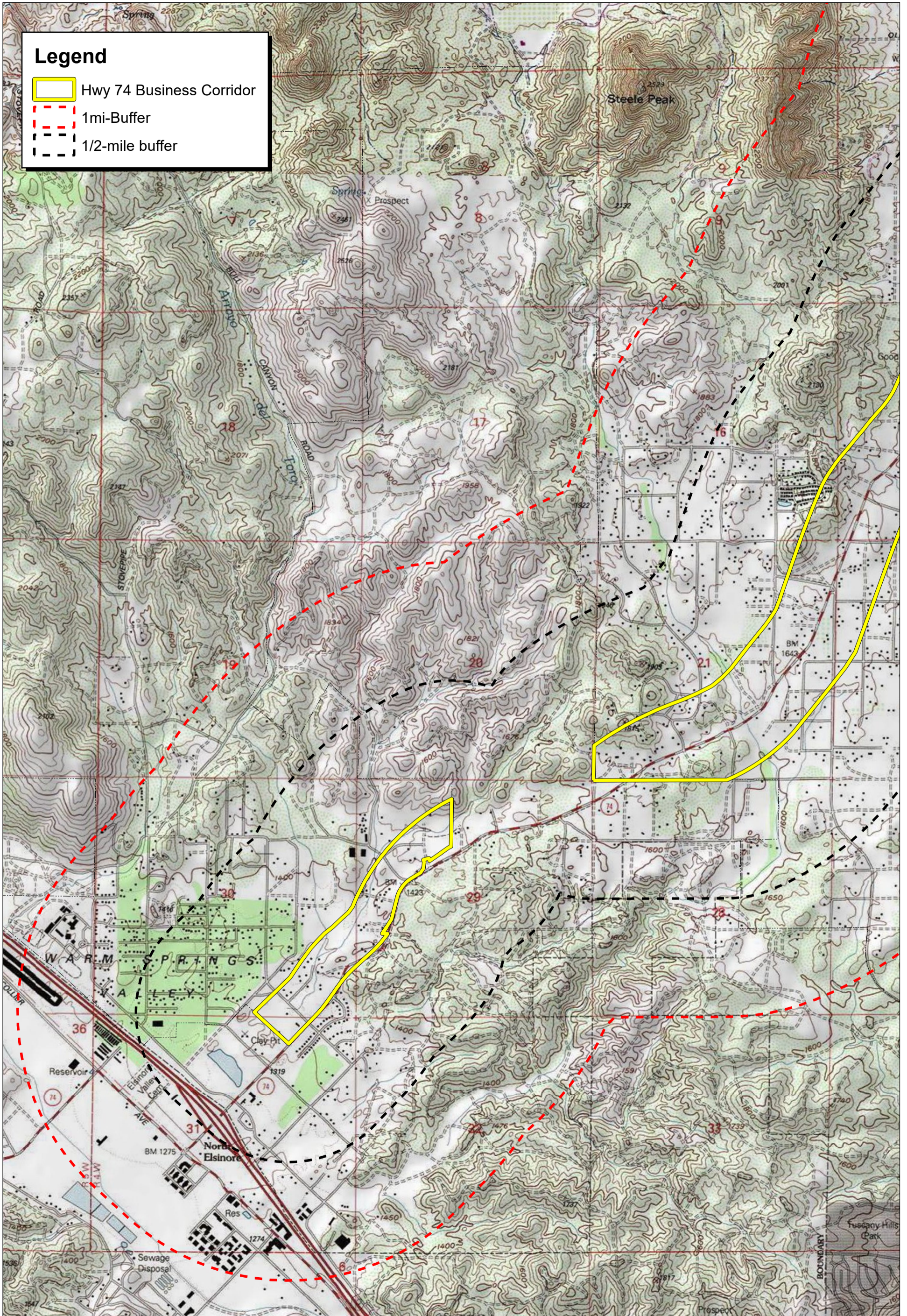

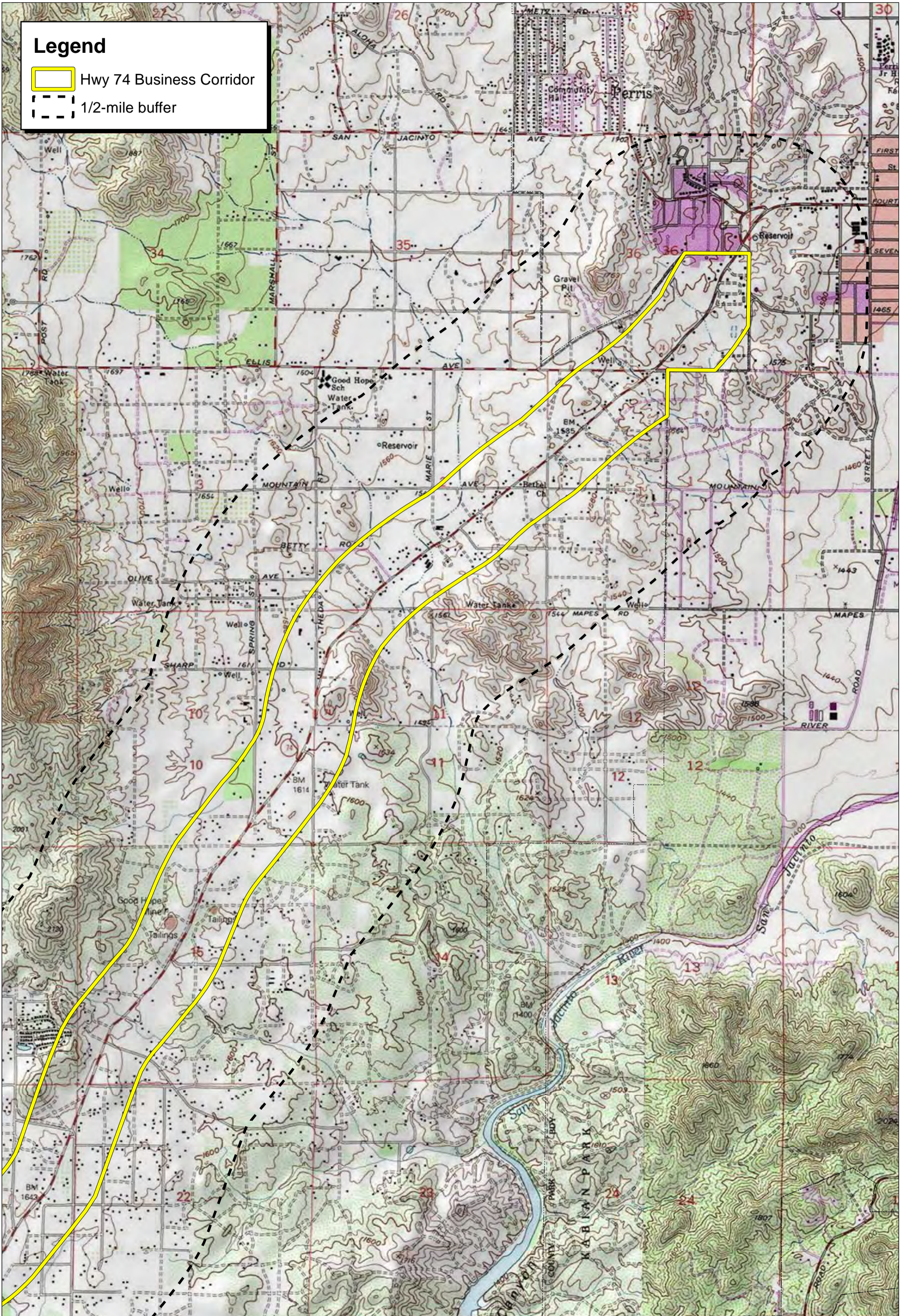

Dear Mr. David M. Smith,

We received your request on May 8, 2017, for a cultural resources records search for the Highway 74 Business Corridor Analysis Project located in various sections, SBBM, in the cities of Steele Peak, Lake Elsinore, and Perris in Riverside County. We have reviewed our site records, maps, and manuscripts against the location map you provided.

Our records indicate that 106 cultural resources studies have been conducted within a one-mile radius of your project area. 17 of these studies involved a portion of the project area. PDF copies of the reports involving the project area are included for your reference. Six additional studies provide overviews of cultural resources in the general project vicinity. All of these reports are listed on the attachments entitled "Eastern Information Center Report Listing" and are available upon request at 15¢/page plus \$40/hour for hard copies, or 15¢/page plus \$40/hour and a \$25 flat fee for PDFs.

Our records indicate that 213 cultural resources properties have been recorded within a one-mile radius of your project area. 66 of these properties involved the project area. PDF copies of the records are included for your reference. All of these resources are listed on the attachment entitled "Eastern Information Center Resource Listing" and "Eastern Information Center Resource Detail".

The above information is reflected on the enclosed maps. Areas that have been surveyed are highlighted in yellow. Numbers marked in blue ink refer to the report number (RI #). Cultural resources properties are marked in red; numbers in black refer to Trinomial designations, those in green to Primary Number designations. National Register properties are indicated in light blue.

Additional sources of information consulted are identified below.

National Register of Historic Places: Two properties (p#33- 7615; 7601) are listed.

Office of Historic Preservation (OHP), Archaeological Determinations of Eligibility (ADOE): one property (p#33-000658, CA-RIV-33-00658) is listed and is ineligible for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places. The applicable portion of this directory is enclosed for your study needs.

Office of Historic Preservation (OHP), Directory of Properties in the Historic Property Data File (HPD): 10 properties (P#33-7608; 33-7645; 33-7638; 33-7665; 33-7622; 33-7604; 33-7607; 33-7656; 33-7611; 33-5779) are listed and are potentially eligible for inclusion on the National Register

of Historic Places. 36 properties (p#33-7660; 33-7613; 33-7663; 33-7664; 33-7609; 33-7637; 33-7666; 33-7667; 33-7616; 33-7668; 33-7669; 33-7673; 33-7678; 33-7658; 33-7600; 33-7587; 33-7602; 33-7603; 33-7654; 33-7683, 33-7685; 33-7686; 33-7588; 33-7589; 33-7590; 33-7591; 33-7592; 33-7593; 33-7594; 33-7595; 33-7596; 33-7597; 33-7598; 33-7599; 33-7688; 33-7687) are not eligible but may be of local interest for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places. Eight properties (P#33-15400; 33-12195; 33-12204; 33-12203; 33-12202; 33-12201; 33-12200; 33-12196) are ineligible for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places. Eight properties (P#33-7606; 33-7662; 33-7614; 33-7605; 33-7651; 33-7610; 33-7657; 33-7655) are not evaluated for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places. The applicable portion of this directory is enclosed for your study needs.

Note: not all properties in the California Historical Resources Information System are listed in the OHP ADOE and HPD; the ADOE and HPD comprise lists of properties submitted to the OHP for review.

As the Information Center for Riverside County, it is necessary that we receive a copy of all cultural resources reports and site information pertaining to this county in order to maintain our map and manuscript files. Confidential information provided with this records search regarding the location of cultural resources outside the boundaries of your project area should not be included in reports addressing the project area.

Due to processing delays and other factors, not all of the historical resource reports and resource records that have been submitted to the Office of Historic Preservation are available via this records search. Additional information may be available through the federal, state, and local agencies that produced or paid for historical resource management work in the search area. Additionally, Native American tribes have historical resource information not in the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) Inventory, and you should contact the California Native American Heritage Commission for information on local/regional tribal contacts.

The California Office of Historic Preservation (OHP) contracts with the California Historical Resources Information System's (CHRIS) regional Information Centers (ICs) to maintain information in the CHRIS inventory and make it available to local, state, and federal agencies, cultural resource professionals, Native American tribes, researchers, and the public. Recommendations made by the IC coordinators or their staff regarding the interpretation and application of this information are advisory only. Such recommendations do not necessarily represent the evaluation or opinion of the State Historic Preservation Officer in carrying out the OHP's regulatory authority under federal and state law.

Dear Ms. Thomson:

Attached is a Consultation List of tribes with traditional lands or cultural places located within the boundaries of the above referenced project.

Government Code §65352.3 (SB-18) **requires local governments** to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding, protecting, and/or mitigating impacts to cultural places in creating or amending general plans, including specific plans. As of July 1, 2015, Public Resources Code Sections 21080.3.1 and 21080.3.2 (AB-52) require **public agencies to consult** with California Native American tribes identified by the NAHC for the purpose mitigating impacts to tribal cultural resources:

Within 14 days of determining that an application for a project is complete or a decision by a public agency to undertake a project, **the lead agency** shall provide formal notification to the designated contact of, or a tribal representative of, traditionally and culturally affiliated California Native American tribes that have requested notice, which shall be accomplished by means of at least one written notification that includes a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation pursuant to this section. (Public Resources Code Section 21080.1(d))

The law does not preclude agencies from initiating consultation with the tribes that are culturally and traditionally affiliated with their jurisdictions. The NAHC believes that in fact that this is the best practice to ensure that tribes are consulted commensurate with the intent of the law.

In accordance with Public Resources Code Section 21080.1(d), formal notification must include a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation. The NAHC requests that lead agencies include in their notifications information regarding any cultural resources assessment that has been completed on a potential "area of project affect" (APE), such as:

1. The results of any record search that may have been conducted at an Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS), including, but not limited to:
 - A listing of any and all known cultural resources have already been recorded on or adjacent to the APE;
 - Copies of any and all cultural resource records and study reports that may have been provided by the Information Center as part of the records search response;
 - If the probability is low, moderate, or high that cultural resources are located in the APE.

- Whether the records search indicates a low, moderate or high probability that unrecorded cultural resources are located in the potential APE; and
 - If a survey is recommended by the Information Center to determine whether previously unrecorded cultural resources are present.
2. The results of any archaeological inventory survey that was conducted, including:
- Any report that may contain site forms, site significance, and suggested mitigation measures.
- All information regarding site locations, Native American human remains, and associated funerary objects should be in a separate confidential addendum, and not be made available for public disclosure in accordance with Government Code Section 6254.10.
3. The results of any Sacred Lands File (SFL) check conducted through Native American Heritage Commission. A search of the SFL was completed with negative results.
4. Any ethnographic studies conducted for any area including all or part of the potential APE; and
5. Any geotechnical reports regarding all or part of the potential APE.

Lead agencies should be aware that records maintained by the NAHC and CHRIS is not exhaustive, and a negative response to these searches does not preclude the existence of a cultural place. A tribe may be the only source of information regarding the existence of a tribal cultural resource.

This information will aid tribes in determining whether to request formal consultation. In the case that they do, having the information beforehand will help to facilitate the consultation process.

Lead agencies or agencies potentially undertaking a project are encouraged to send more than one written notice to tribes that are traditionally and culturally affiliated to a potential APE during the 30-day notification period to ensure that the information has been received.

If you receive notification of change of addresses and phone numbers from tribes, please notify me. With your assistance we are able to assure that our consultation list contains current information.
