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

Dear Supervisor Washington,

I would like to add to my letter via Campaign of a 1000 letters. I bought my home in Aguanga in 2016. I am an Emergency Room RN. I am single and worked extremely hard to purchase my home and pay my mortgage. I was so thrilled to have a home with property that finally allowed me to live my dream of having and raising horses.

Recently I was riding my horse with a friend on some of the dirt roads near my home. I was horrified to see at least 35 large scale grows. Often times there is merely greenhouses and a motorhome or camper on the property. A few months ago, the home next to me sold. The new owners immediately began a large scale grow. Over the last week alone, I have witnessed a HUGE increase in criminal activity. I recently found out that I live on "Marijuana Mile". The home next to me, across from me, and every house past mine is growing marijuana on a large scale. My neighbor told me that after calling to report to the Sheriff, the deputy merely responded "It is legal now". I have also been told that illegal growers are 85% of home buyers in this area. It has become the norm rather than the exception.

Are these massive operations being regulated in any way? I am sure that the legal regulation of marijuana would equal massive revenues for the County of Riverside. This would possibly allow our area to have a greater number of deputies needed for this area. It is my understanding that there are only 2 deputies assigned from Temecula to Palm Desert. The first night in my home I was forced to call because at 10pm there were shots being fired near my home. It took 2 hours for a deputy to respond. In fact I was charged with "Assault with a deadly weapon" after being forced to defend myself and my grandchildren on a remote after being attacked by a young man with a lengthy criminal record. I merely showed him my weapon so that he would allow us to leave the road where he had trapped us. Of course I was arrested after the attacker called 911 at least 5 times and stated that I pointed my gun at him without cause. I didn't call because there is no cell reception, and secondly, I knew there was no way they could get there in time. I have been told this numerous times by deputies that I have encountered at my place of work.

After being bankrupted to the tune of more than \$50,000, I am awaiting trial to finally tell my side of the story on June 21. As an RN, I of course am held to a higher standard. That is no problem. I have never even received a traffic violation in my 51 years on this planet. I am a law abiding citizen that was forced into a horrible situation where I was forced to defend myself and my family after being terrorized and then trapped after this young man tried to force me to hit him in my vehicle, then moving his vehicle to block our escape. Now a ruthless District Attorney refuses to drop the charges because "his boss won't let him". I feel this never would have happened if we had a reasonable amount of police protection out here. This is so difficult to grasp for me when I see so much going on around me. I am in fact, being forbidden from doing my job that I do, indeed truly love. I not only voted for you, but to legalize marijuana because I thought it would be regulated. Clearly this is not the case. Not only do I not feel safe, but the deputy confiscated my weapon after I was arrested ALL THE WAY IN SAN JACINTO. I just wish that deputy had been there to protect me rather than arrest me. He pretty much didn't care when I explained what happened.

Mr. Waashington, I would like to thank you in advance for your thought and consideration.

The local residents (5,500 population) are opposed to these Marijuana grows, but helpless to defend themselves without law enforcement.


We desperately need your help enforcing the "*Controlled Substances Act, 1970*", using all the substantial powers Congress vested you with in 1973.

Dear Supervisor Washington,

I am a lifelong resident of the Idyllwild area of the San Jacinto Mountains. My Grand Father Harry Wendelken came to this area in the early 1920s.

Four years ago I moved to Anza. When I moved in to my area there were no marijuana grows that I could see anywhere near me. It wasn't until a few months later that I started smelling an unpleasant skunk smell. Turns out my across the street neighbor was in fact growing. His operation was well hidden and very low key. Not a lot of traffic, no trash or noise just an unpleasant smell every now and then. Fast forward 4 years and I can count 10 grows in different stages of operation within view of my house.

Last year the smell was so unbearable there were days that I could not work in my yard. My granddaughter who visits me often loves to play outside. She now says "Mimi I want to go inside, it stinks out here" I have friends who won't come over because the smell makes them so nauseous they can't stand it. It affects me the same way, but I have to stay! This is unacceptable.

My neighbors hire people to work their grow. They move in travel trailers and the people are different every year. My road is strewn with trash. They have had "guard" dogs that escape and run the neighborhood. Last year two of the dogs killed another neighbors chickens. After the season is over growers all over Anza and Aguanga abandon their guard dogs leaving the community to deal with these poor hungry animals.

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

Dear Supervisor Washington,

As you know the Anza/Aguanga corridor is under siege from illegal commercial cannabis growing operations. These black market commercial operations are posing a very severe threat to the quality of life for the residents of this area. According to our electric cooperative our power grid is being stretched to the breaking point because of illegal growers. Our water resources are also being attacked with many residents finding well levels lowered because of adjacent large greenhouse operations. Commercial wells are not allowed in this area due to ongoing water rights litigation yet millions of gallons of water are being diverted for illegal purposes. Families and seniors are living in fear of retaliation if they contact authorities regarding commercial cultivation nuisances.

I urge you and the rest of the County of Riverside Supervisors to validate the **Preliminary Working Draft – Regulatory Framework for Cannabis-Related Businesses Report** as developed by your staff. It is especially important that you pay heed to the staff recommendation that ***“cannabis cultivation of any type be prohibited in all residential zones, R-1, R-1A, R-A, R-R, R-2, R-2A, R-3, R-3A, R-T, R-T-R, R-4, R-5, R-6, R-7, R-D, MU, W- 2-M Zones.”***



